Commissioner Vicites said the IP fund is used to pay salaries and he asked if there is enough money in the fund. Mr. Kovacs said there is a cushion of funding to cover this and the salaries. He said it is cost effective.

He said they formerly had a LERTA program and this is to bring it to all parts of the city for commercial or industrial use. He said taxes will be paid on the current value and the exemption would be for a time frame on any improvements. Solicitor Purcell said LERTA is limited to commercial and industrial. He said they are looking for a 100 percent, five-year exemption. He said the past has been a graduated sliding scale amount. Mr. Hercik said the school districts prefer the sliding scale. A discussion ensued about the proposed ordinance.

- Hourly wages for transportation staff for the round trip
 - Calculated at \$17.75/hour
 - 2 staff members facilitating the transport

The estimated cost for a shelter transport for a Fayette County client is \$120.00.

The cost breakdown is as follows:

- 80 miles @ \$0.50 = \$40.00
- 2 staff @ 2.25 hours each @ \$17.75/hour = \$80.00
- Mileage and staffing = \$120.00
- The child is in the car for 40 miles
- \$120/40 miles = \$3.00/mile

The mileage fee will be waived if the client is in a residential shelter for 15 days or if MST opens the case. Adelphoi will not open MST services without a county referral, authorization for care or court order.
