Commissioner Vicites said he is glad to see these two municipalities are taking the initiative to acquire properties to get the blight off of them. He said it is encouraging.

Chief Clerk Revak read the agenda for a motion to “Consider approval of, upon recommendation of the County Controller, the issuance of an RFP for audit engagements for the Drug Task Force, the Clerk of Courts, the Prison Commissary, and any outstanding Tax Sales, as determined by the County Controller.”

Commissioner Lohr said the motion needs to be reworked, adding that they talked about it at the agenda meeting. He asked Controller Abraham if he wanted to do the RFP or not. Solicitor Purcell said the controller has primary responsibility over the audits, so it is up to the controller how he wants to handle it. He said he thinks the amendment to the county code calls for the commissioners to do supplemental audits but not the primary or official audit. Solicitor Purcell said the controller needs to be involved, adding that it can be a joint effort. Controller Abraham said due to health issues his senior auditor will not be available and he needs a team as soon as possible. Commissioner Lohr asked if there were additional audits determined by the controller that need to be in the RFP.

Commissioner Lohr said in doing the prison project, the USDA is looking at everything. He spoke about the North Fayette Water Authority getting funding and how it may come back on the county. Commissioner Lohr said they have to operate on caution and safety which means if there is a ding on any part of the finances the USDA or any company can look at that as a negative. He said that is why he wants to make sure all audits get completed. Commissioner Vicites said the tax claim daily audit account needs audited. Commissioner Lohr said he thinks the terminology needs to be broader. Commissioner Dunn said the motion they talked about at the agenda meeting was the drug task force, Clerk of Courts. He said that Controller Abraham said with additional training his staff can do Register of Wills, Recorder of Deeds, tax collectors and district justices. He said if there are other things, they have to discuss it.

Commissioner Dunn said there is a memo on June 10 and there is a contract from June 7 that will magically cover all of it, they need to discuss it. He said they shouldn't hash it out in the middle of a meeting, it can't be. Commissioner Lohr said he doesn't know what else is out there. Commissioner Dunn asked if they are going to discover that today. Commissioner Lohr said he would rather operate on safety, adding that they are on a timescale. He said if the audits are not done properly and on time the money

can be stopped by the state and federal government. Commissioner Vicites said they are choosing audits in the RFP, but anything they find, can't they be done by the controller's office when they get up to full staff? Controller Abraham said with the unfortunate health condition of the one auditor, he has one girl that has been on the job a week. He said the row offices need to be done by year end but that is one that could be done with training. Commissioner Vicites said they have to know what needs audited to accurately put an RFP out. Controller Abraham asked to add all the row offices in the motion in addition to Clerk of Courts. A discussion occurred about what offices should be added to the motion.

Commissioner Dunn said he is disturbed that he is walking into a meeting and getting three minutes notice to what they are going to do. He said he went to the extra length on Monday to make sure everyone knows what they were voting on, and he gets three minutes in the meeting. He said to do what they are going to do. He said he is disturbed. Commissioner Lohr said he was thinking about it through the night, he didn't plan it before. Commissioner Vicites said they discussed the other row offices on Tuesday. Commissioner Lohr said they can go with it just like it is, he is just trying to make sure they are safe. Commissioner Vicites said they would have to amend the agenda to add it. He said they have to make sure the audits are done in a timely manner to not hurt the credit rating. Commissioner Dunn said he is all for discussing it. Commissioner Lohr then asked for a motion as it was discussed on Tuesday.
