

A special meeting of the Fayette County Board of Commissioners was held at 6 p.m. on Thursday, October 13, 2022 at the Fayette County Courthouse, 61 East Main Street, First Floor, Uniontown PA.

The meeting was called to order by Commissioner Lohr. A silent prayer was held, which was followed by the pledge of allegiance.

Commissioner Lohr asked for a motion to consider approval of a resolution fixing the salaries of county officers pursuant to County Code, 16 P.S. 11011-10.1 for the years 2024 to 2029, adding that it needs to be changed to 2026 to 2029. Solicitor Purcell said it needs to be changed because there is an existing resolution that covers through 2025. He said this is extending four years beyond that resolution. Solicitor Purcell then read the following resolution:

A RESOLUTION FIXING THE SALARIES FOR ELECTED COUNTY OFFICERS FOR THE COUNTY OF FAYETTE, PENNSYLVANIA, FOR THE YEARS 2026, 2027, 2028, AND 2029.

WHEREAS, the Act of November 1, 1979, P.L. 246, No. 82, Section 1, et seq., as amended [16 P.S. Section 11011-1., et seq.] empowers, authorizes and directs the County Commissioners to fix the salaries of all County officers governed by the provisions of said Act; and,

WHEREAS, the duly elected County officers of Fayette County, Pennsylvania, have petitioned the County Commissioners of Fayette County, Pennsylvania, to schedule a public meeting to consider the adjustment of salaries.

NOW, therefore, be it resolved as follows:

SECTION 1.

The salaries of the County officers governed by the provisions of the above-mentioned Act are hereby fixed so that there is a three percent (3%) increase in each salary from the amount paid the immediate prior calendar year, that being 2026 through and including 2029. An increase of three percent (3%) per annum is set for each annual salary for the indicated officers for the 2026, 2027, 2028, and 2029 calendar years. These salary increases shall be effective when a County officer begins a new term of office in accordance with the limitations of the Pennsylvania Constitution.

SECTION 2.



SECTION 3.


This Resolution shall be effective as of the 13th day of October 2022, for the years of 2026, 2027, 2028, and 2029.




