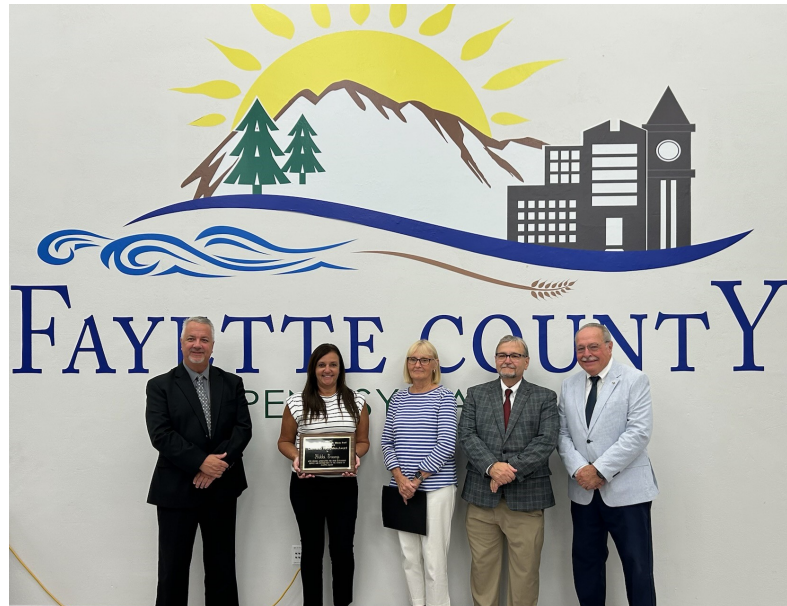

Back to School Safety Reminders

As the new school year has recently began, it is important for families, students and community members to keep safety top of mind. With more children walking, biking, and riding buses, extra care helps ensure everyone arrives at school and home safely.

Road Safety: Drivers should reduce speed in school zones and remain alert for children crossing the street. Always stop for school buses when lights are flashing, and avoid distractions while driving near schools.

Walking and Biking: Students should use sidewalks and crosswalks whenever possible. Bicyclists are encouraged to wear helmets and bright clothing to stay visible. Remind children to look both ways before crossing and to follow the directions of crossing guards.

Bus Safety: Children should wait at a safe distance from the curb, board one at a time, and remain seated during the ride. When exiting, they should always cross in front of the bus where the driver can see them.

At School: Families can also support safety by reviewing Emergency procedures, encouraging safe play, and Reminding students to speak up if they see unsafe behavior.

By working together, we can help create a safe and welcoming environment for all students.
