Suicide Prevention Awareness Month

September is recognized as Suicide Prevention Awareness Month, a time to remember those lost to suicide and to promote hope and healing in our communities. On September 17th, community members gathered on the front steps of the Fayette County courthouse for a Remembrance Vigil honoring loved ones lost to suicide.

Members of the Suicide Prevention Taskforce shared messages about prevention, support, and the importance of aftercare for those affected by suicide. Brittney Balchick, the evening's guest speaker, offered a moving account of her own lived experience, inspiring attendees with her message of resilience and recovery.

The ceremony concluded with a memorial Roll Call, paying tribute to the lives lost and reinforcing the community's ongoing commitment to awareness, compassion, and prevention.



Fayette County Behavioral Health Administration employees proudly showed their support during Suicide Prevention Awareness Month. On September 26th, in recognition of Tie Out Suicide Day, staff wore the colorful tie-dyed shirts they had created just days earlier. Then, on October 24th, employees wore their "*Stay Another Day*" sweatshirts to continue raising awareness and showing solidarity for suicide prevention efforts.


