Early Intervention

Early Intervention (EI) in Pennsylvania consists of services and supports designed to help families with children who have developmental delays or disabilities. EI services can include information about how children develop, parent or caregiver education, family supports, developmental and instructional therapies that assist in child development. EI builds upon the natural learning that occurs in the first few years. It is a process that promotes collaboration among parents, service providers and others who are involved with the child.

Every child grows and learns at his or her own pace.

Children can vary in skills and development.

You know your child better than anyone else.

If you have concerns about your child's development, Early Intervention can help.

During the COVID-19 Pandemic, Early Intervention services are being provided to eligible and interested families utilizing tele-intervention.

Early Intervention Birth-3 services can include:

Physical Therapy, Occupational Therapy, Speech Therapy, Special Instruction, Nutrition Education, Hearing/Vision Support

Tracking services are available based on the following categories:

- Low Birth weight
- Cared for in Hospital NICU
- Prenatal Substance Exposure
- Referred by County Children & Youth Agency
- Exposed to Lead
- Experiencing Homelessness
