



## **SERVICES AND SUPPORTS**

### **FOR CHILDREN IN FAYETTE COUNTY**

**Outpatient Psychiatric Services**—Counseling services provided in an office setting including psychiatric evaluation and medication management. Outpatient services are also offered in all Fayette County school districts.

**Inpatient Hospitalization**—Inpatient service that provides 24-hour psychiatric care in a hospital. There are several psychiatric hospitals that serve children within 50 miles of Fayette County.

**Early Intervention**—provides services and supports designed to help families with children, from birth to age 5, who have developmental delays or disabilities. Services are provided at no cost to families. To make a referral call 1-800-692-7288.

**Supports Coordination**— offers choice of services and providers to children and adults who qualify for ID services. These services are based on need and are monitored for frequency and duration per Individualized Service Plan (ISP).

**Blended Case Management**—Provides case management to work with children and families to find local services like counseling, medical services, recreation programs, tutoring, housing, and more. Supports Coordinators assist children with intellectual disabilities much the same way.

**Intensive Behavioral Health Services (IBHS)**— support children, youth, and young adults with mental, emotional, and behavioral health needs. IBHS offers a wide array of services that meet the needs of these individuals in their homes, schools, and communities. IBHS has three categories of service: 1) Individual services which provide services to one child; 2) Applied Behavior Analysis (ABA) which is a specific behavioral approach to services; and 3) Group services which are most often provided to multiple children at a specific place. Evidence-based treatment (EBT) can be delivered through individual services, ABA services, and group services.

**Early Learning Resource Center** – provides single point-of-contact to gain information and access services that support high-quality child care and early learning programs. Call 1-800-548-2741.

**Community Residential Rehabilitation/Host Home**—Provides host parents, a therapist, additional support services, and case management. The Host Family must meet specific standards and attend many hours of training. Most important is the commitment and partnership to provide a safe and therapeutic home for high-risk youth.

**Family-Based Mental Health Services**—Family therapy services provided in the child's home by a team of professionals trained in family therapy. The team works with everyone in the family to improve family relationships and helps them take advantage of other resources in their community. This service can also help the child and family address issues at school.

**High Fidelity Wraparound**—A team approach that builds on the strengths of the family and their supports. The Team brainstorms ideas with families to develop plans around **their** needs. Call (724) 430 - 4907.

**Mental Health Residential Services**—Sometimes children or adolescents need some time away from home to benefit from treatment. Options include residential treatment facilities and diversion / stabilization programs. Parents are actively involved in the planning and delivery of treatment services for their child with the goal of a successful transition back home.

**Multi-Systemic Therapy (MST)** - MST works with youth ages 10-18 and their family to address behaviors like aggression, truancy, substance abuse, or ongoing conflict at home or school.

**Partial Hospitalization**—Day program that includes mental health treatment under the direction of a psychiatrist as well as an educational program. This can help children avoid hospitalization or out-of-home placement.

**Parent Child Interactive Therapy (PCIT)** - PCIT children age 2 to 7 who struggle with disruptive and/or difficult behavior including verbal or physical aggression, defiance, noncompliance, temper tantrums, or ADHD symptoms. PCIT is an evidence based practice and proven to enhance parent-child relationships.

**Parent Advisor**—If you are experiencing problems with existing services and/or providers that impact your child's education or to access resources, information, referral, and support regarding education call (724) 438-6738.

**Family Advocate**—We work with families and system partners to improve and achieve positive outcomes for families. We do this by supporting each other, sharing our stories, participating in trainings and advocating for positive change. For more information call 724-430-4907.

**School-Based Student Assistance Program (SAP)** - Identifies "at risk" youth and provides resources and referrals to other community agencies.

## **OTHER RELATED SERVICES**

**Fayette County Community Action Agency**—Provides services including case management, food bank, WIC, housing programs, education and employment assistance. Call (724) 437-6050.
