

Developmental Disabilities Awareness Month Carnival



March is celebrated each year as Developmental Disabilities (DD) Awareness Month. Fayette County historically observed DD Awareness Month by holding its annual Board Meets Board event. The event invited local provider agency board members, staff, local representatives, individuals, and families to celebrate their success stories from the previous year. As with many events and traditions, COVID derailed plans to celebrate the past four years. As we move beyond COVID and the restrictions put in place during the pandemic, FCBHA took a look at previous events and decided to break from tradition.

A carnival will be held in observance of DD Awareness Month on Tuesday, March 12, 2024 from 5:00-8:00 p.m. at the old Faith Assembly of God gymnasium located on Morgantown Road in Uniontown, PA. Local intellectual disability provider agencies, county staff, and representatives from local advocacy and recreation organizations/groups will come together to play games, award prizes, enjoy good music, good food, and good company. Individuals and their families who benefit from ID/DD services and supports will be invited to attend, along with those traditionally invited to the Board Meets Board event. Planning is in progress and more information will be provided as it becomes available.

Local provider agencies were also asked to share information on any activities planned during the month of March. All activities will be shared via a calendar that will be distributed to all interested parties for optimal participation.



Food and Clothing

As prices for just about everything continue to rise over the last few years, finding area assistance programs and resources can make all the difference in providing necessary staples for individuals and families. There are several organizations located in Fayette County that offer food and/or clothing assistance.

The Fresh Fire Church, located at 171 Connellsville Street in Uniontown holds a food distribution event the second Thursday of each month, unless it falls on a holiday. Distribution begins at noon and runs until all food is distributed. This is a drive-through distribution with no income guidelines or pre-registration required.

This organization also offers a monthly clothing give away through their Norma's Closet program. Norma's Closet, located at 300 Evans Street in Uniontown, provides sizes from infant to adult and includes apparel for women and men. Occasionally, housewares and toys are given out as well. There is an on-site collection box available 24/7 for those who would like to donate items.

The Fresh Fire Church welcomes volunteers to help with their community efforts. Please call (724) 580-7027 for more information on volunteer opportunities or to get dates for their clothing distribution.

East End United Community Center (EEUCC) located at 150 Coolspring Street in Uniontown has several assistance programs.

- * The Child and Adult Care Food Program (CACFP) is a federal assistance program supported by the United States Department of Agriculture to provide daily, subsidized food service for an estimated 3.3 million children and 120,000 elderly or mentally or physically impaired adults in non-residential, daycare settings.
- * Food Pantry-EEUCC distributes food boxes the first Wednesday of each month to individuals and families facing food insecurity. The pantry provides options for those with varying dietary needs and preferences, including seniors.
- * EEUCC houses a community garden and has a Farm to School program. This program, funded by the Department of Agriculture, teaches students how to grow, prepare, cook and share local food products. It empowers children to become more aware, engaged and informed about their local food system.
- * EEUCC also has a Clothing Closet stocked with a wide array of essential items for every season, offered free of charge to those in need. It provides support for students when going back to school after summer break and to new moms via baby clothes and other essentials.

Fayette County Community Action Agency (FCCAA) Food Bank is designated as the warehouse for collection and storage of food for individuals in need of food assistance.

The food is distributed through a network of volunteer food pantries, congregate feeding sites and soup kitchens. The Food Bank program includes emergency food assistance, the PA Senior Food Box Program and the Weekend Snack Pack Program for children.

St. Vincent de Paul offers a comprehensive range of services to support the community.

At their Thrift store, open Tuesday through Saturday from 10 am to 2 pm, patrons can find quality items at affordable prices. Additionally, their emergency food pantry, operating Tuesday through Friday from 10 am to 2 pm, ensures immediate assistance to those in need. As a distribution site for the Community Action Food Bank, registered families can collect monthly boxes on Saturdays from 10 am to 2 pm or by appointment. The Assistance Center is a pivotal resource providing diverse support, including financial aid for utilities, clothing, and household items post-emergency or disaster. Community Based Care Management

to Address Social Determinants of Health

Social determinants of health (SDH) are the non-medical factors that influence health outcomes. Addressing SDH appropriately is fundamental for improving health and reducing longstanding inequities in health. When your social determinants of health needs are met you are then free to focus on your overall mental health wellness and recovery.

Fayette County's Community Based Care Management (CBCM) Program started in 2021. The CBCM Program serves Fayette County residents with a mental health and/or substance use diagnosis by providing access to resources that address social determinants of health. The goal of this program is to decrease inpatient hospitalization stays and emergency room visits and increase community-based treatment/services. We accomplish this goal through partnerships with community-based organizations, such as Fayette County Community Action Agency and the East End United Community Center. Fayette Area Coordinated Transportation (FACT) and St. Vincent De Paul are also instrumental to the CBCM program. The program continues to grow and serve the community.

The program will assist Fayette County residents with the following social determinants of health:

- > Safe and secure housing
- > Employment
- > Utility assistance
- > Clothing
- > Financial strain
- > Child care
- > Food
- > Transportation
- > Physical healthcare

The overall goal of the CBCM program is to ensure wellness in every area of someone's life. Members enrolled in the CBCM program will work with a team to develop a plan to address their needs.

Fayette County Behavioral Health Administration is taking referrals for the CBCM Program and also will be at St. Vincent De Paul on Fridays from 10:00am-2:00pm.
